

Hind Terminals commences double stack operations from Mundra

To facilitate speedy clearance of north Indian ICD boxes

HIND Terminals Pvt. Ltd (HTPL) has achieved a new landmark in container rail transportation by commencing double stack operations from Mundra Port to Kishangarh (near Jaipur), Rajasthan.

This will be a regular service to facilitate expeditious clearance of north Indian inland container depot (ICD) boxes from the Port. The objective of the service is to evacuate ICD cargo as soon as possible. Already three trips have been made since the commencement of the service a few days back.

A double stack rake can carry 180 TEUs, twice the normal 90 TEUs.

While the service is currently permitted to run only up to ICD-Kishangarh, HTPL is hopeful of being given the go-ahead to extend it to ICD-Patli in Gurgaon soon.

Currently HTPL operates weekly seven trains from Mundra to the National Capital Region (NCR) and five trains from Mundra to Sahnewal.
