

A value-added service towards a world class facility **HTPL CWC Logistics Park CFS inaugurates BoI branch**

NAVI MUMBAI, Sept. 11

IN another value-added service to the trade, the Hind Terminals Pvt. Ltd (HTPL) CWC Logistics Park container freight station (CFS), near JN Port, inaugurated a branch of the Bank of India (BoI) at its premises at Bhendkal village here.

The honours were jointly done by Mr Susheel Tyagi, Regional Manager, CWC, Rear Admiral Anand Kalaskar, COO of HTPL, and Mr Shirish Kulkarni, Zonal Manager (Raigad Zone), BoI, in the presence of other HTPL, CWC and BoI officials.

The 1,000 sq. feet branch will not only handle the accounts of the CFS but, importantly, also collect Customs duty, with franking facility a possibility later. It will facilitate handling the financial transactions of the various HTPL verticals, be it the rail division or exports.

Nearby CFSs would also be able to avail of the facility for their needs, it was highlighted.

Both Mr Tyagi and Rear Admiral Kalaskar stressed that this was a much-needed facility for the trade in the area— especially in this era of time-bound deliveries—who had to otherwise avail of banking facilities nearly 15 km away. Rear Admiral Kalaskar highlighted that this was part of HTPL's focus on providing value-added services to customers and making the CFS a world class facility.

Mr Kulkarni said that the performance of the CFS was one of the factors that convinced BoI to open this facility.
